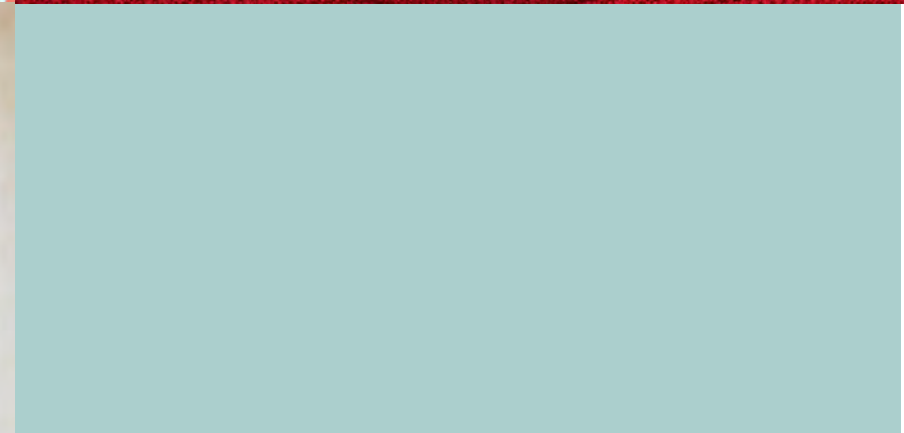

L.A. REPAIR

Participatory Budgeting

A program of the LA Civil Rights Department



The **Los Angeles Reforms for Equity and Public Acknowledgment of Institutional Racism (L.A. REPAIR)** is L.A.'s first Participatory Budget pilot program. Participatory Budgeting has been used in New York City, Chicago, and over 7,000 other cities worldwide.

L.A. REPAIR distributes \$8.5 million directly to nine communities, called REPAIR Zones.

Three REPAIR Zones completed the participatory process in Spring 2023, and the winning programs include rental assistance, a new community garden, expanded after-school programming, and mobile health care services. **The six REPAIR Zones highlighted on the map are currently in the participatory process.**

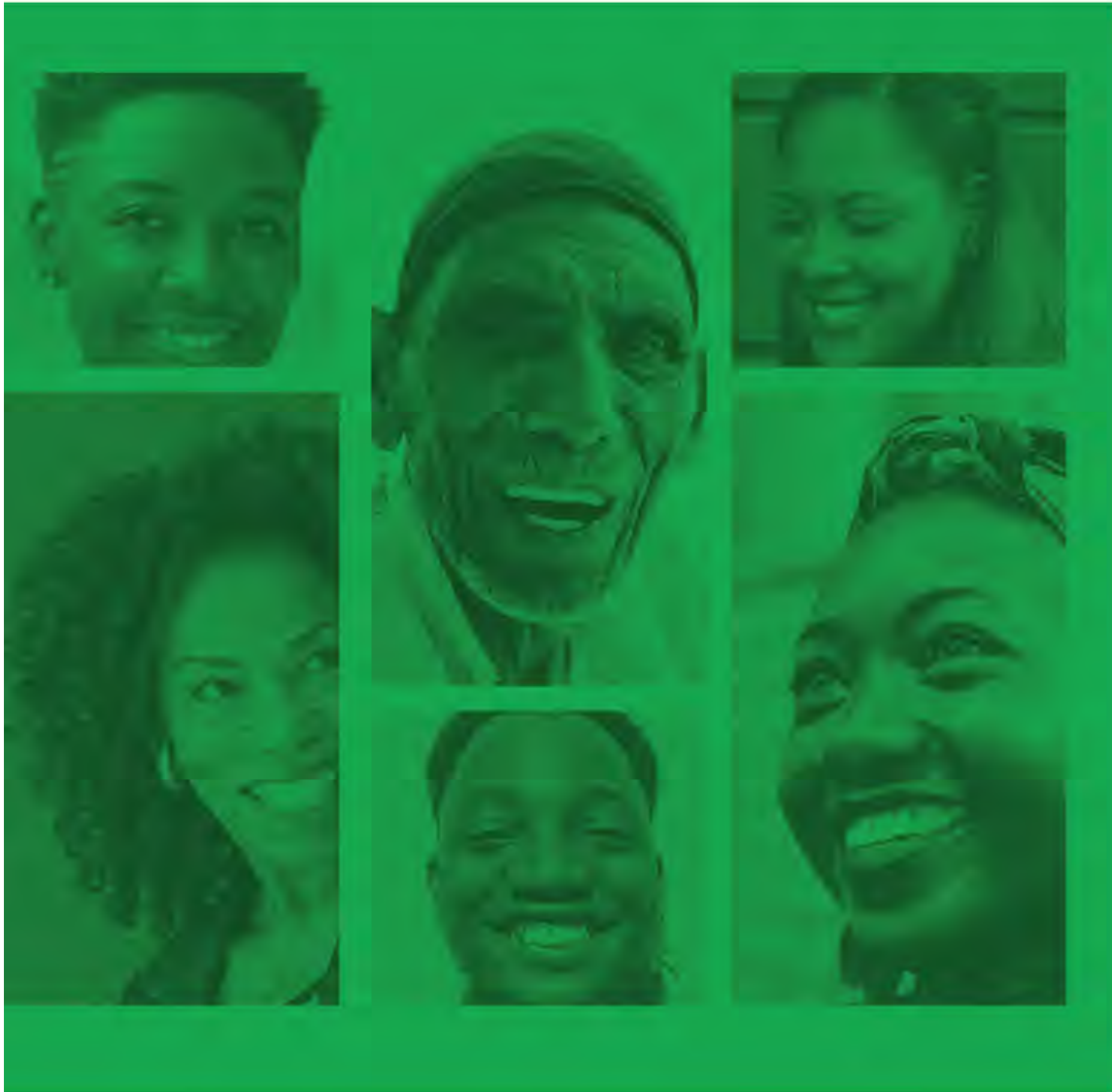
