

Civil Rights Enforcement

Addressing discrimination in private commerce, education, employment, and housing



CH **Civil and Human Rights Ordinance**

LA Municipal Code Chapter IV, Article 16, Sec. 51.03

No person shall discriminate against another person in private employment, housing, education or commerce on the basis of actual or perceived protected class.

Our Authority

Investigate discrimination complaints and enforce the LA Civil and Human Rights Law through subpoenas, fines, and corrective action.


Participatory Budgeting

A program of the LA Civil Rights Department

The City's most marginalized communities decide how to budget **\$8.5 million for new programs** through a direct democratic process.

Participatory Budgeting empowers the community to propose ideas, vote on proposals to fund, and implement new services and programs. **Over 7,000 cities worldwide have done Participatory Budgeting**, including New York City and Chicago.

So far, 3 communities decided to budget over \$3 million for expanded **after-school programming** in Watts, **mobile medical services** throughout Southeast LA, **rental assistance** in Boyle Heights, and **a new community garden** in the Valley.




In March, **6 more communities will vote** on how the remaining \$5.4 million should be budgeted. **Anyone 15+ years of age** who lives, works, studies, or is the parent or guardian of a student in the REPAIR Zone can participate!

Voting Guidelines

Proposals on the ballot were created by local nonprofits in response to ideas submitted by the community last year.

Proposals with the most votes will be presented to the Mayor and City Council to fund, and then implemented in the community next year.

Anyone 15+ years old that lives, works, studies, or is the parent/guardian of a student in the REPAIR Zone, is eligible to vote - no documentation required.


